

Henry Kimball Warren (1895-1925)

Following the resignation of President Free, the Board of Trustees selected Rev. Henry K Warren as the school's third president. When the trustees offered Rev. Warren the position, he was the head of the Congregational school Salt Lake College. His three-decade tenure was the longest of any of the school's leaders.

Robert Hamilton Warren, the youngest son of the president was named the school's third Rhodes Scholar. In 1914 he sailed for England to begin his studies at Oxford which turned out to be a fateful trip. After the fall term, Warren volunteered with the American Committee of Belgian Relief and went to France during his winter vacation to join the American Ambulance Service. He worked exhaustedly in the Neuilly sector and fell victim to a debilitating illness which caused his death in November of 1916.
